

Troop 40 Camping Code of Conduct

Camping is an exciting and important part of Scouting. Most of our Scouts would say that it is their favorite activity. However, it is labor and time intensive. Time in planning campsites and camp programs is freely given by our parent volunteers. Parents give their weekend time to make these trips possible by accompanying our Scouts and teaching them important skills while in camp. Parents are asked to review the following guidelines with their son and return the signed acknowledgement.

1. Camping is a privilege, not an automatic right of Scouting.
2. Parents and/or leaders who accompany Scouts on camping trips expect the very best attitude and conduct from Scouts. The following behaviors are unacceptable:
 - a. Rude or inappropriate language, including swearing
 - b. Lack of consideration for one's fellow Scouts
 - c. Put-downs
3. Leaders and fellow Scouts will treat each other with respect at all times.
4. Of all camping concerns, safety is the most important. Actions or conditions that create unsafe situations, especially with regard to campfires and cooking fires, will not be tolerated.

We want camping to be fun, but safe for everyone. Scouts who choose not to follow the rules in the Camping Code Contract will, at the discretion of the Scoutmaster, have their camping privileges revoked until such a time that he is satisfied that the rules will be followed. I understand that I may be contacted to pick up my child and bring him home at my expense for inappropriate behavior or conditions which may create a safety or other hazard to him or others.
